He offers a series of interpretations that cumulatively advance theoretical discussion by challenging scholars to rethink the critical paradigms of postmodernism. At the center of the book is a discussion of the quintessentially classic Valéry poem *Le Cimetière marin* and the classic qualities it shares with Pindar's third Pythian ode, from which Valéry derives the epigraph for his poem.
